CREW to Host LKQ/Keystone, NSF for Aftermarket Parts Discussion

The October 21 Collision Repair Executive Webcast (CREW) will welcome Rob Wagman, LKQ Senior Vice President of Operations, Wholesale Parts and Terry Fortner, Vice President of Industry Relations and Market Development, both from LKQ/Keystone Automotive Industries, along with Rob Frayer P.E.
